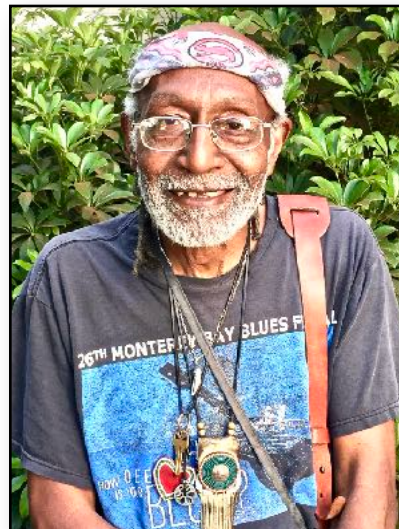
RESIDENT PROFILE: ADMIRAL/TAGLITO

Admiral Pat Arnold, also known as Taglito G. Wanderer Atpay, was born in Ft. Worth, Texas and has had a colorful life. His career has included a wide swath of roles: spiritual Guru, writer, poet, playwright, actor, political activist and concert promoter.

He studied acting at the prestigious Lee Strasberg Studio and his first play was produced in 1982 at the Santa Monica Playhouse. In 2001 he produced a concert at the Pladium in Santa Barbara to raise money to feed Ethiopia and Eritrea where many were dying. His latest screenplay, *Three Of A Kind* is in the works at Stronghold Productions, and that's just a few of his accomplishments.

Most recently, he was a guest on UCSB's radio program, *Writer's Almanac*, hosted by Lynette Paulick. The main topic was a discussion of Taglito's latest book, a novella titled, *Omar Khayyam and Etta James Mooning Santa Barbara*, which was published in 2014. During the interview, Taglito discussed his current efforts to get John Lennon's song *Imagine* established as a co-national anthem, and to this end he met last year with Representative Lois Capps and presented her with his new Bill of Rights which, if passed by Congress, would have *Imagine* played at all occasions after the National Anthem. A bold initiative that Taglito is passionate about.

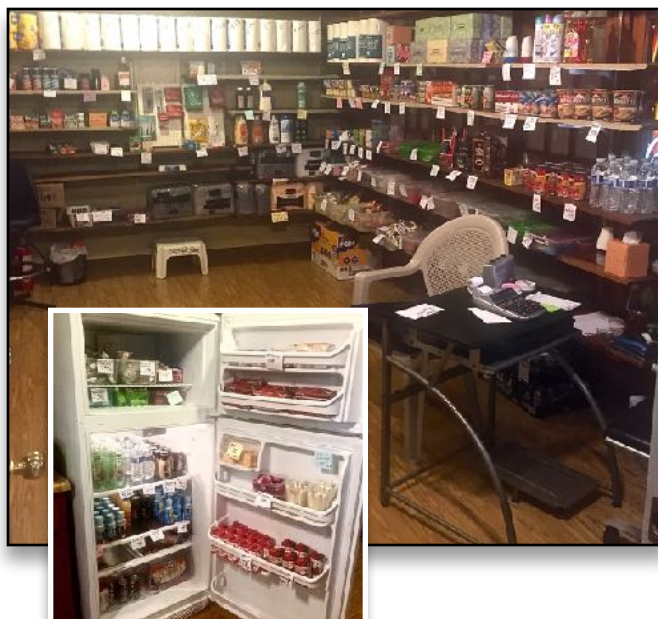


DOROTHY'S CORNER STORE: COME VOLUNTEER!
