
“LOLLI” DOLORES HENDERSON

FM & RSC UPDATE

Notes from the December General RSC Meeting

- Dan reported on the solar water heating system, the panels of which can be seen on the roof. The system was first generation and installed in the late 1970s. The system pumps and pre-heats our “hot” water before it goes to the boiler room, which saves a lot of money each year. The company has gone out of business and they simply gave FM the system, which will save money as the system was “rented” all this time. All FM has to do is maintain what’s already in place.
- Dan reiterated that special accommodations will be made for Residents during the upcoming remodel on the elevator. During that time, the field next door will be opened for parking cars, and free meal delivery service will be available for those who truly cannot get down stairs.
- It was reported that our census now stands at 198 people. Only two suites currently remain unoccupied. This is good news, as the more overall income the Manor receives helps keep individual ongoing costs down.
- It was reported that the new RSC Board had their first meeting and that four bags of potting soil/mulch had been purchased for use by Resident Gardeners.
